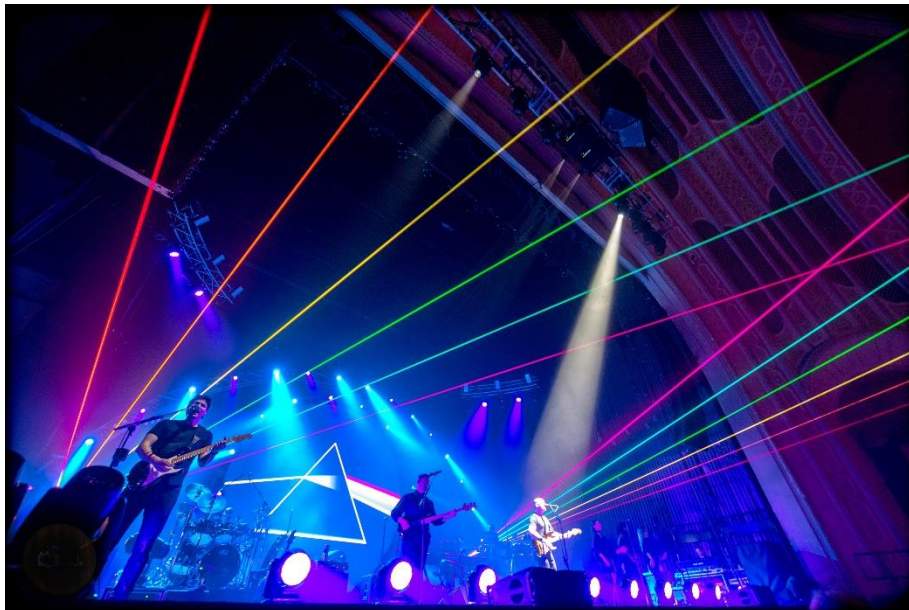

## ***Brit Floyd World Tour 2022 to return to The Hanover Theatre***

The World’s Greatest Pink Floyd Tribute Band [\*Brit Floyd\*](#) takes to The Hanover Theatre and Conservatory for the Performing Arts stage to perform its brand new production on Sunday March 20, 2022 at 7 PM.

The Brit Floyd show has become a phenomenon, widely regarded as the world’s greatest rock tribute show. Faithfully recreating the scale and pomp of the final 1994 Pink Floyd tour, complete with a stunning multi million dollar light show, iconic circle screen, lasers, inflatables and theatrics, this show is a musical masterpiece.

After performing with The Australian Pink Floyd Show for 17 years, Damian Darlington formed *Brit Floyd* in January 2011. Having performed over 1,000 shows since its launch in Liverpool, England, *Brit Floyd* have circled the world, sold out tours across Europe, North America, South America and the Middle East, and performed concerts at some of the world’s greatest venues, including London’s prestigious Royal Albert Hall; the awe inspiring Red Rocks Amphitheatre in

Denver, Colorado; the historic Greek Theatre in Los Angeles, and 'The Showplace of the Nation', NYC's Radio City Music Hall in Manhattan.

In their decade of touring, the band has featured several musicians from Pink Floyd's studio and touring band. Pink Floyd vocalist and bass player Guy Pratt and saxophonist and rhythm guitarist Scott Page performed with *Brit Floyd* in 2013 and 2015 respectively.
