Celebrate the Kick-Off of THT's Free Concerts on the Outdoor Bank of America Stage at the Francis R. Carroll Plaza Ribbon Cutting!





Worcester, Mass. - The Hanover Theatre and Conservatory for the Performing Arts (THT) is thrilled to announce the exciting and free <u>Summer Music Series</u>, featuring live entertainment on the newly created Bank of America Stage and culinary delights from a variety of food trucks. "We are excited that the Francis R. Carroll Plaza, with the outdoor Bank of America Stage on our doorstep, will allow us to

offer even more opportunities for free programming to our community," said Troy Siebels, President & CEO of THT.

Bank of America awarded a \$250,000 grant during the Theatre District Campaign to THT to support the plaza project and help revitalize the theatre district, which includes the plaza and outdoor stage in front of the theatre.

"A vibrant arts and culture scene is a key factor in the revitalization of downtown Worcester. It attracts tourism, creates jobs and has a ripple effect throughout the region's economy," said Edwin Shea, president, Bank of America Central Massachusetts. "The new outdoor staging at The Hanover Theatre will serve both as a world-class performance space and as a catalyst for future growth, bringing a whole new level of vitality to the city."

To kick off the eagerly anticipated unveiling and rededication of the Francis R. Carroll Plaza, THT will be hosting a <u>ribbon cutting ceremony</u> on Wednesday, July 19 at 4:30 PM. This event is free and open to the public, and will feature music from <u>Dan Gabel and Kim Hawkey Songbook Duo</u> as well as performers from The Hanover Theatre's upcoming Youth Summer Program production of <u>Fiddler on the Roof</u>. Attendees can also grab a bite to eat from The Dogfather, Bees & Thank You and Easy Street Tacos during the ribbon cutting.

The <u>Ribbon Cutting</u> is just the start to a fantastic summer of fun on the Bank of America Stage! On the following Wednesday, <u>July 26</u> at 12 PM, a captivating performance by the talented <u>Occasional Brass and Strings</u> will be the first of six concerts in the free lunchtime Summer Music Series. Join us on <u>August 23</u> for a soul-stirring performance by the exceptionally talented bluegrass and folk inspired artist <u>Rachel Sumner</u>. Accompanying this musical experience will be Coney Island Lunch and Uhlman's Ice Cream food trucks.

Concluding the free lunchtime Summer Music Series on Wednesday, <u>August 30</u>, <u>Dan Gabel and Kim Hawkey Songbook Duo</u> will transport you back to the golden era of 1940s big bands.
